Topic

This term we are now beginning to learn and recognise our numerals to 10 and match these to amounts. We are continuing with our learning of 'more' and 'less' and beginning to use these to



Physical Development

We are enjoying PE lessons indoors every Thursday, and are now going in smaller groups to learn how to use different types of equipment safely and effectively. As well as their fine and gross motor skills, it really supports your child's independence to be dressed in Velcro or zip/slip on shoes each day for school instead of laces, so they can practise dressing alone on occasions we take our shoes off.

We will continue exploring with a range of fine motor activities this term to support our finger muscles' development, including: lego, peg boards, threading, cutting, messy play, pouring, drawing with large chalks, painting and having a go at zipping up our coats!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We began this year by sharing some of our celebrations over Eid and Easter with our friends.

We are going to continue to think about how to care for our friends, planet and animals.

We are going to think about how we deal with strong emotions and what we do when things get tricky!

Communication and Language

On our bug hunts, we are going to be learning and using prepositions to describe where the minibeasts are.

We are going to be supported to use a range of sentences verbally, to talk about what is happening now and what has happened in the past.













Literacy


We will enjoy lots more stories this term and continue to enjoy quality stories and nursery rhymes everyday! We are now growing our interest in reading and choosing books we know well to re-tell to our friends!

We are spending more time learning to recognise our names, to prepare us to attempt to write them and be able to put our names on our creations by the end of Nursery. If you would like to work with your child at home on this, please support them to do so in lower case as this will help them with future letter formation.

Key texts

Our key texts this term are 'Superworm' and 'The Very Greedy Bee'. We will be explaining, predicting and re-telling what has happened in the stories when sharing them with adults.





Messages

- Books will continue to be changed every Tuesday. Please note that we encourage the children to choose their own book, while we try and encourage them to enjoy a range of stories, this does sometimes mean they will choose the same book again. Please use this as an opportunity to ask them what they love so much about the story!
- Unfortunately, we sometimes do miss books in bags. To support everyone with this, we
 will be asking that you take out your child's book and reading record and place it in a
 box at the gate every morning, to ensure all books brought in have been seen. We ask
 you bring in your book and reading record every day.
- We have all grown a lot this year! Please check that as well as weather appropriate clothes, your child has a change of clothes that still fit them in school. This helps us to ensure your child has a suitable change when accidents happen!
- Please note that we are currently close to full in both Nursery and Little Stars, if you wish to move to afternoons or move your child to full time please email the office so we can check we have space to provide this. Unfortunately, the receipt of a full time code does not currently mean we can guarantee your child a full time space. If you fill out an application from now on for the 30 hour code, this will not be in action until September, due to the deadline being the 31st March.
