Forest school

This week in Forest school the children helped chop wood to make a fire. We then toasted marshmallows on sticks we'd chiselled the week before. The children loved learning about the process of making fires and especially enjoyed eating their yummy treats.







Reading

This week your child will have received a clear plastic zip wallet to keep their reading books and reading record in. This will help the children keep all their stuff together, and make changing books and monitoring reading records easier. Each morning the children will take their reading wallet out of their bag and place it in a designated box in the cloakroom. Remember, whilst books are changed on a Friday, reading books and records still need to be brought into school every day.

We would like to clarify that reading books will <u>only be changed on a Friday</u> if we see evidence in the reading record that <u>each book</u> has been read <u>at least three times</u>.

Sound talk Simon says

A crucial part of reading is blending. In other words, putting the sounds together to say the word. One way you can practise this skill at home is by playing sound talk Simon Says! This game works like normal Simon Says except the adult 'sound talks' part of the instruction. For example, I might say "Simon says tap your I - e - g".
