Reading

This week we have been focusing on recognising high frequency words. You can find them in the front of your child's reading diary.

To support their reading, here are some games to practise at home to enable the children to recognise the words quickly.

Can you play high frequency word snap?

Can you play high frequency word bingo?

<u>Phonics</u>

If your child is in Moonbeam phonics class they have been learning to read and write the diagraphs **ear**, **air**, **er**. If your child is in Rainbow or Sunshine phonics Class they have been revisiting the sounds **II**, **ff**, **ss**. Can your child read these letters and think of a word that has these sounds in?

Can you read the words: With, that, this Can your child look in a book and find any of these words?

<u>Maths</u>

This week we have been learning about the 2D shapes square and rectangles. We have been exploring the different features of square and rectangle to enable us to find them in our environment.



Can you find any squares or rectangles in and around your house?

<u>Topic</u>

This week our topic has been Superheroes. Here are some fun things you could try at home:

- Can you make a superhero out of playdough?
- Can you make a secret base out of junk?
