- Can your child draw a picture of the characters and add thought bubbles? Can they write a sentence about how the characters might be feeling? Why would they feel like that?









## Literacy

# **Maths**

This half-term in Maths we will be counting and exploring the composition of numbers up to  $\frac{1}{2}$  10. We will also be learning about measuring length, height, 3D and patterns.

★Here are some ideas to support your child at home:

- Go on a 3D shape hunt around the house.
- Investigate who has the longest feet in the house? Which toy is the tallest?
- Can you make a pattern with natural resources?

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### **Phonics**

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We cannot stress enough the importance of having your child read to you daily. Children should be reading their books a minimum of 3 times to ensure they are understanding the sentences they are reading and to become a more fluent reader. It is noticeable when children are reading regularly at home.
