- 3) Find out and write about the work of the Mexican Artists Frieda Kahlo and Diego Riviera.
- 4) Write a tourist information guide to one of Mexico's famous Mayan or Aztec sites such as Chichenitza, Tulum or Palenque.
5. Find out about some of Mexico's amazing plant and animal life- it is perhaps the most diverse country on the planet in terms of it's 'flora and fauna'.

- 1) Make a model of a Mayan or Aztec Temple.
- 2) Make a sugar skull using icing sugar paste.
- 3) Draw yourself in the style of a Frieda Kahlo self portrait.
