MATHS

Practise reading and writing numbers to 100 ensuring that number are written in the correct orientation. Keep practising your spelling of days of the week, months on the year and numbers to twenty. Keep practising your quick recall of number bonds to 10 and 20. You will definitely need these for Year 2!!

Practise your phase 3 and 5 sounds... and your **REAL WORDS and ALIEN WORDS**
