Topic

Our Topic this term is The Polar Regions - Looking After Our Planet. In this topic we will be investigating the Artic and Antarctica, the life that can be found there, and how this differs from our life. We will also be investigating environmental issues surrounding these regions. We will continue to look at environments and discuss natural and human made objects in the world. We will also be looking at the worlds' continents and oceans, and be revisiting the countries that make up the United Kingdom.

Maths

In maths we will continue to look at addition and subtraction, using concrete materials, part-part-whole models, drawing pictures to work out answers and explore problem solving and reasoning to find answers and justify them. We will also be continuing to look at place value in numbers up to 50 and the composition of these numbers.




We will continue to use concrete resources to deepen our understanding and ensure we are able to use different counting strategies to find the total amount, and counting out how many 'tens' and how many 'extra ones' make up a number. (eg. 16 is one group of ten and six extra ones).


It would be great if you could keep exposing children to the language of time, as we will begin to start telling the time to o'clock and half past in the coming terms. Later in the term we will be looking at measuring length and height as well as mass and volume.

English

This term we will be studying the stories Lost and Found and Dear Greenpeace.


We will be writing letters and post cards, drawing story maps and rewriting familiar stories... and even tweaking them to make them our own. We will continue to talk about nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs. Keep practising letter formation at home encouraging children to form their letters with the correct composition and make sure they are sitting on the line!





Reading

We cannot stress enough the importance of having your child read to you daily. We are asking for a minimum of 10 minutes each day. It is noticeable when children are reading regularly at home and they are proud to share this with the class. When your child is confident with their home reader, please send it back in so we can change it and send a new one home.



Science

This half term we are discussing properties of materials. We will be looking at what objects are made of and why that material is suitable for its purpose. We will sort these materials and group them by their properties discuss what items we could make with those materials. At the end of term, we will make a boat in DT out of suitable materials. Please send in any junk modelling materials that we could use for our boats.



P.E

For the first half of the Spring term we will be having one outdoor and one indoor PE session. This may mean that the PE days change. Please look out for further notices about this. Our outdoor sessions could be chilly so please send your child in warm clothes on these days e.g. school colour jogging bottoms and their school jumper.
