
Maths

This term, we will cover many topics in maths! We will start with fractions, learning how to divide objects into halves and quarters. Throughout the term we will learn about shape, money, time, mass and volume. There are lots of activities that you can do at home to help your child with their learning in these areas e.g. cooking/baking together (weigh the ingredients), tell the time together (see how long it takes to get ready in the morning, or get to and from school) and count the change from the shop (see how quickly the different coins can be recognised).

English

Reading

Every child should have a home reading book and a reading diary. Both of these should be brought into school every day. We try to read every day with a group of children and if your child forgets their book it may mean that they miss out on reading with an adult in school.

Your child's reading diary should be signed every time your child is reading at home, this could be a book, magazine, a newspaper of their choice or their reader from school. We are going to be giving out rewards for every five times they read. This can only be monitored if the reading diary is being signed and is coming to school every day.

We cannot stress enough the importance of having your child read to you daily. We are asking for a minimum of 10 minutes each day. It is noticeable when children are reading regularly at home and they are proud to share this with the class. When your child is confident with their home reader, and answering questions about the book, please write a little comment to explain what kind of things you have spoken about at home.



Science

This term we will continue the study of weather and seasonal change and will continue to track weather patterns for each month. We will continue to classify different animals (birds, mammals, reptiles, fish, mini-beasts and amphibians- and look at their characteristics) and study their habitats (particularly those that live in our local area). These are nice conversations you can have with your children when you are out and about at the park or if you spot any animals on your way home from school.
