- The Amazon Rainforest is the largest wet tropical forest in the world.
- It is in South America, mostly in Brazil.
- It is 25 times bigger than Britain.
- It absorbs 40% of our global pollution of carbon dioxide and is described as the lungs of the world.
- The Amazon River is the largest river (not the longest).
- A lot of trees in the Amazon are being cut down. This is called deforestation.
- There are lots of plants and animals in the Amazon, including jaguars, sloths, spider monkeys, giant otters and many more.
- There are over 2.5 million different insects.
- The Amazon rainforest floor is in complete darkness.
- The Amazon is hot and humid all year round.
- Lots of the plants found in the Amazon can be used in medicines.
