WRITING AND TOPIC

You have a scrap book to use to complete your homework project. Over the next few weeks you could complete some of these activities or you can make some up of your own. You can upload photographs of completed work to Google Classroom or bring in your scrap book to share.

Writing tasks you could have a go at:

1. Write a non-chronological report about an animal during the Stone Age - don't forget to illustrate it.
2. Dress up as either a Stone Age or Iron Age person and take a photograph. Write an autobiography about your life.
3. Write a recipe using Stone Age ingredients. Have a go at making it and take a picture of your final dish.
4. Create a comic strip to show a typical day in the Stone Age. Think what a caveman/woman might do—hunting, making weapons/tools.

Art and Science:

1. Imaging you are a Nomadic hunter Gatherer. Make a series of 4 cave paintings that communicate messages about your day. Use materials of your choice. i.e. mud, clay, grass, fruits and berries.
2. Find out about jewellery in The Bronze Age. Make a piece of jewellery.
3. Design and make an ancient stone circle or a replica of Stonehenge. Be creative in the way you make your stone circle.
4. Find out about at least 3 different types of rocks (these could include precious gemstones). Present your findings in an interesting way.
5. Create a piece of artwork from things you find in the park/garden/woods etc
