Writing tasks you could have a go at:

1. Write a non-chronological report about a famous mountain range or a volcano.
2. Create your own informative video on Volcanoes. Could you talk about how they form? Significant volcano eruptions?
3. Fact book about volcanoes/ Pompeii with a front cover, contents page, information on at least 3 topics in your own words, pictures and a glossary
4. Write a first-hand account on what it might be like living next to an active volcano
5. Design a tourist leaflet encouraging people to visit Naples, Vesuvius and / or Pompeii

Geography/ Science:

1. Make a working volcano model with labels / explanation of how it works
2. Design a volcano survival kit with diagrams, labels and an explanation of how it works
3. Create a board game inspired by the 'volcanoes topic'
4. Draw a picture of a volcano scene
5. Draw a map of the Volcano eruptions around the world
6. Create a mountain diorama. What animals might you find in your mountain range?
