Roman Britain was a province of the Roman Empire from 43 to 409 AD. The Romans originated from Italy and were annoyed with Britain for helping the Gauls (the French) fight against the Roman general Julius Caesar. The Romans came to Britain looking for riches: land, slaves, and mostly, iron, lead, zinc, copper, silver and gold. *They stayed in Britain from AD 43 to AD 410; almost four hundred years! Legacy: The Romans left their legacy all over the country. They gave Britain new towns, roads, plants, animals, a new religion and ways of reading and counting (currency too).
